Prayers before Sleep

Kiss the cross and make the sign of the Cross over the bed, head to foot and then side to side, saying this prayer to the precious Cross:

Let God arise; let his enemies be scattered. Let those who hate him flee from before his face. As smoke vanishes so let them vanish, as wax melts before the fire: so let demons flee at the presence of those who love God and sign themselves with the sign of the Cross, and say joyfully: Rejoice, most precious and life-giving Cross of the Lord, which drivest demons away through the power of our Lord Jesus Christ, who was crucified on thee, who descended into hell, trampled down the power of the devil, and gave to us his precious Cross for the routing of all enemies. Help me forever, most precious and life-giving Cross of the Lord, together with the holy Lady Virgin Theotokos and all the saints. Amen.

O God, absolve, remit, and pardon our transgressions, voluntary and involuntary, committed in word or deed, thought or intention, whether in knowledge or in ignorance, whether by day or by night: forgive us everything, for thou art good and lovest mankind.

And, before falling asleep:

Into thy hands, O Lord Jesus Christ my God, do I commend my spirit. Do thou bless me, have mercy on me, and grant me life everlasting. Amen.

Then make the sign of the Cross.

Epistle of the Sunday (2 Peter 1:10-19)

Therefore, brethren, be even more diligent to make your call and election sure, for if you do these things you will never stumble; for so an entrance will be supplied to you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

For this reason I will not be negligent to remind you always of these things, though you know and are established in the present truth. Yes, I think it is right, as long as I am in this tent, to stir you up by reminding you, knowing that shortly I must put off my tent, just as our Lord Jesus Christ showed me. Moreover I will be careful to ensure that you always have a reminder of these things after my decease.

For we did not follow cunningly devised fables when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of His majesty. For He received from God the Father honor and glory when such a voice came to Him from the Excellent Glory: "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." And we heard this voice which came from heaven when we were with Him on the holy mountain.

And so we have the prophetic word confirmed, which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts;

Gospel of the Sunday (Matthew 17:1-9)

Now after six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, led them up on a high mountain by themselves; and He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as white as the light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, talking with Him. Then Peter answered and said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if You wish, let us make here three tabernacles: one for You, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them; and suddenly a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!" And when the disciples heard it, they fell on their faces and were greatly afraid. But Jesus came and touched them and said, "Arise, and do not be afraid." When they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only.

Now as they came down from the mountain, Jesus commanded them, saying, "Tell the vision to no one until the Son of Man is risen from the dead."

Tone 4 Festal Hymn to the Theotokos

Magnify, O my soul, the Lord Who was transfigured on Mount Tabor!
Thy childbearing was without corruption;
God came forth from thy body clothed in flesh, and appeared on earth and dwelt among men.//
Therefore we all magnify thee, O Theotokos.

Communion Hymn

O Lord, we will walk in the light of Thy countenance, and will exult in Thy Name forever. (*Ps.* 88:15) Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

And so on the mountain he showed his Apostles the glory of his divinity, concealed and hidden by his humanity. For they saw his face bright as lightning and his garments white as light. They saw two suns; one in the sky, as usual, and one unusually; one visible in the firmament and lighting the world, and one, his face, visible to them alone. His garments white as light showed that the glory of his divinity flooded from his whole body, and his light shone from all his members. For his flesh did not shine with splendor from without, like Moses,[10] but the glory of his divinity flooded from him. His light dawned and was drawn together in him. Nor did depart somewhere else and leave him, because it did come from another place and adorn him, nor was it for his use. And he did not display the whole depth of his glory, but only as much as the limits of their eyes could encompass (St Ephraim the Syrian)
