Epistle of the Sunday (Eph 2:14-22)

For He Himself is our peace, who has made both
one, and has broken down the middle wall of

one new man from the two, thus making peace,
and that He might reconcile them both to God in
one body through the cross, thereby putting to

Nativity Fast

On **Wednesday, November 15** we began,
together, the Nativity Fast, sometimes called the St
Philip's Fast, or sometimes called by the Western
term, Advent. The Nativity Fast is a 40 day
preparation to prepare our bodies, minds, and
hearts for the Christmas feast.

We're encouraged to do the following things with
God's help and through our effort:

- Eat less and give that money to the poor.
- Increase our prayer, scripture reading,
silence and church attendance.
- Make a sincere confession and receive
communion as often as possible.
- Fast from meat, (fish with backbones on
weekdays), dairy, olive oil and wine (fish
with backbones, wine, and olive oil are
permitted every Saturday and Sunday
before Dec 20,
and on Nov 16 &
30, Dec 4, 6, 12
& 20.)

The fasting guidelines are
maximal and are meant
to be a goal combined
with prayer and charity.
Everyone should do what
they can to strengthen
their spiritual life, but not
fast to discouragement.

Today in Church School

Today's lesson: Woman at the Well

Questions to ask/review:

- Who made the well Jesus rested on?
(Jacob)
- Why was the woman surprised that Jesus
would speak to her? (at that time, men did
not speak to women alone and she was a
Samaritan, not a Jew)
- What kind of water did Jesus offer the
woman? (living water that gives everlasting
life)
- What two things caused the people of
Samaria to believe that Jesus was the
coming Messiah? (first they heard the
account of the woman, then followed Jesus
and heard for themselves)
- What is evangelism? How did the woman
practice evangelism?
- Is there anyone you know who does not
know about
Jesus?
Have you
told them?
Why or why
not?



Suggested activities at home:

- Have your
child select
a friend and
tell him
about
Jesus.
- Have your child go to the "well" (a bucket of
water) each time he wants a drink.
Decorate the bucket to look like a well.
- Prayer: Jesus, teach me about You so that
I can tell my friends about my wonderful
Lord. Amen.
