Troparion of the Resurrection Tone 6

The angelic powers were at Thy tomb; the guards became as dead men. Mary stood by Thy grave, seeking Thy most pure body. Thou didst capture hell, not being tempted by it. Thou didst come to the Virgin granting life. O Lord who didst rise from the dead, glory to Thee!

Troparion of St Nicholas Tone 4

You appeared to your flock as a rule of faith, an image of humility, and a teacher of abstinence. Because of your lowliness heaven was opened to you! Because of your poverty riches were granted to you! O holy Bishop Nicholas, pray to Christ our God to save our souls.

Kontakion of the Resurrection Tone 6

When Christ God the Giver of Life raised all the dead from the valleys of misery with His mighty hand, He bestowed resurrection on the human race. He is the Savior of All, the Resurrection, the Life, and the God of all.

Kontakion of the Theotokos Tone 6

Steadfast protectress of Christians, constant advocate before the creator, do not despise the cry of us sinners, but in your goodness come speedily to help us who call on you in faith. Hasten to hear our intercessions and to intercede for us, O Theotokos. For you always protect those who honor you.

Prokeimenon (Psalm 27:9) Tone 6

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance.

Epistle (II Corinthians 4:6-15)

For it is the God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of us. We are hard-pressed on every side, yet not crushed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed— always carrying about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body. For we who live are always delivered to death for Jesus' sake, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So then death is working in us, but life in you.

And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, "I believed and therefore I spoke," we also believe and therefore speak, knowing that He who raised up the Lord Jesus will also raise us up with Jesus, and will present us with you. For all things are for your sakes, that grace, having spread through the many, may cause thanksgiving to abound to the glory of God.

Gospel of the Sunday (Luke 6:31-36)

And just as you want men to do to you, you also do to them likewise.

But if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive back, what

credit is that to you? For even sinners lend to sinners to receive as much back. But love your enemies, do good, and lend, hoping for nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High. For He is kind to the unthankful and evil. Therefore be merciful, just as your Father also is merciful.


Communion Hymns of the Sunday

Love Your Enemies

61. 'But I say to you,' says the Lord, 'love your enemies ... do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who mistreat you' (Matt. 5:44). Why did He command this? To free you from hatred, irritation, anger and rancor, and to make you worthy of the supreme gift of perfect love. And you cannot attain such love if you do not imitate God and love all men equally. For God loves all men equally and wishes them 'to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth' (1 Tim. 2:4).

62. 'But I say to you, do not resist evil; but if someone hits you on the right cheek, turn to him the other cheek as well. And if anyone sues you in the courts, and takes away your coat, let him have your cloak also. And if anyone forces you to go a mile, go with him for two miles' (Matt. 5:39-41). Why did He say this? Both to keep you free from anger and irritation, and to correct the other person by means of your forbearance, so that like a good Father He might bring the two of you under the yoke of love.

Today in Church School

Today's lesson: St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians

Verse (younger classes): Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it. (*I Cor 9:24*) or Love... does not seek its own. (*I Cor 13: 5*)

Questions to ask/review (younger classes): How is our life similar to a race? What is our "prize"? What can help us to win the race? What do we need? What does it mean to "not seek your own"? What can you do this week to practice not seeking your own?

Verse (older classes): For in fact the body is not one member, but many. (*I Cor 12:14*)

Questions to ask/review (older classes): In what way can the Church be called the body of Christ? How does Jesus work in the world today? (through us) Do we all have the same talents? What are your talents? What part(s) of the body are you most like?

Suggested Activities at home:

Read and discuss this week's Scripture verse. Run relay race in the backyard with family or friends. Discuss how life is similar to the race. Follow through on your child's action plan to share this week. Prayer: Lord, give me strength and health to run the race of life as did thy saints. Prayer: Lord, let me love my neighbor today, as You love me.
